The online Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies (BIS) is a flexible degree completion program designed for students who want a custom-built degree tailored to their own career goals.

BUILD YOUR OWN DEGREE

The Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies degree allows students to custom build a degree that meets their own educational and career goals. Students can select courses from multiple specialties and general electives to help them develop the knowledge, skills, and attitudes needed to prepare them for their chosen career.

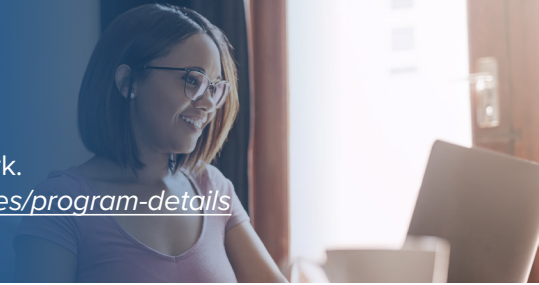

Requirements for the Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies

To earn the Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies degree, students must complete the degree components listed below:

- General Education Core** 34 credits
- Two Concentrations** 30 credits
- Capstone Project** 6 credits
- Electives** 50 credits*
- Total: 120 credits**

*At least 24 elective credits must be upper division (300- or 400-level) courses

In order to earn the Bachelor of Interdisciplinary Studies degree, students must complete two 15-credit concentrations and two 3-credit capstone courses while achieving a minimum cumulative grade point average (GPA) of 2.0 in the concentration and capstone courses.
